- is age 55 or older;
- is able to live safely in a community setting;
- meets criteria for nursing facility level of care as defined by DSHS;
- lives in our service area;
- is Medicaid eligible or willing to pay privately (Providence ElderPlace premium equals the Medicaid rate).

What is the cost?

What you pay depends on your financial situation. If you financially qualify for Medicaid services, you may pay a monthly participation fee depending on your income. Those who do not qualify financially for Medicaid pay the Providence ElderPlace private pay premium. There are no co-payments or deductibles. Providence ElderPlace covers all necessary medical and social services, and the premium rate does not change based on your changing needs.
