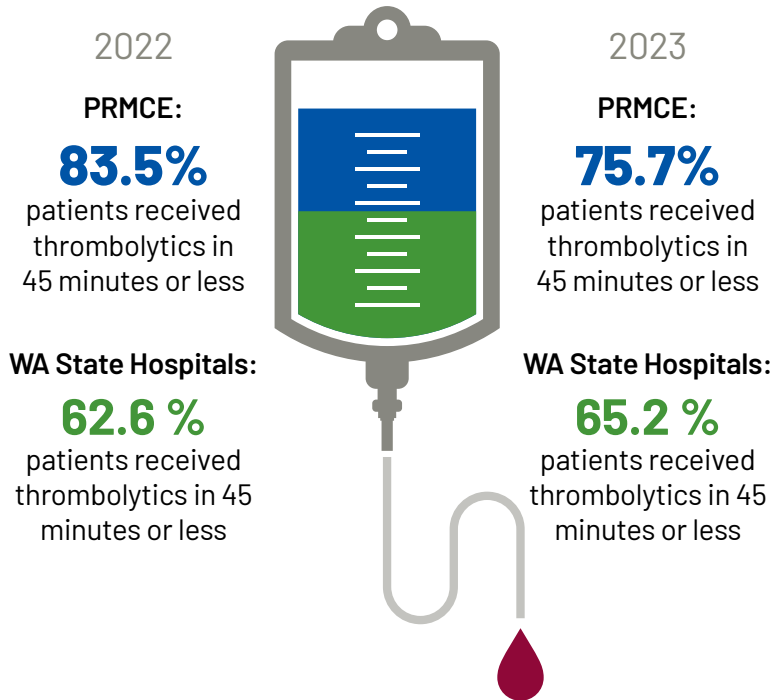


Stroke Care at Providence Everett

When it comes to stroke, the saying goes, “time is brain.” This means that the faster a person can receive clot-busting medication, called thrombolytics, the better their chances at a positive outcome. The goal is to administer thrombolytics within 45 minutes or less for at least 75% of stroke patients.

Providence Everett publicly reports our data to help educate our community about our exceptional treatment times and stroke outcomes.



Outcomes: What about going home?

Providence Everett retrieves nearly a hundred clots from patients brains each year.

65%

of patients receiving thrombectomy are discharged home, home with home health, or to inpatient rehab in preparation for returning home.

This exceeds the performance of most thrombectomy-capable and comprehensive stroke centers.
